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1. Open Discussion

Monique Anderson (Salvation Army/Shay Foundation) Announced the Shay Foundation will host their back-to-school bash, August 14th from 5 pm to 7 pm for Beaver Falls students. Any student in need after the event can also receive assistance. They are looking for donations, contact Monique if interested in donating. See attached flyer. Monique also shared the recovery and wellness program has availability for individuals in recovery or a CoC housing program. She announced that Harmony House has 1 upcoming opening.

Haley Bell (Inglis) Reminded the group of the upcoming statewide conference in September, she encouraged those interested to register. She announced that scholarship applications are due July 22nd.

Dina Ciabottoni (CoC) Announced the BCBH community survey is active and can be found in the save the dates link. She encouraged the group to complete the survey, especially for those who work directly with clients. The survey allows direct care workers to discuss challenges they may face. Dina also shared the Red Cross monthly report, stating that there are no fires to report for Beaver County.

Raquel shared that in honor of the Women's Center's 50th anniversary, they will be hosting an art show. The art show will take place on October 24th at the art gallery in New Brighton. They are looking for domestic violence or sexual assault survivors to submit artwork for the show. She stated the art can be any form such as drawings, paintings, poetry or any art. CoC & Home4Good RFPs

Dina Ciabattoni

Dina announced there are currently two funding applications available that can be found on the Community Development website under invitation to bid & proposal. The CoC funding application is due on July 10th by noon this application has new opportunities for transitional housing and supportive services only. The Home4Good application is due on July 23rd by noon to Community Development. This application allows for a broader definition of homelessness and flexibility with funding to fill in the gaps.

Veteran Anti-Suicide Subcommittee

Shante' Thompson

Shante' shared that she is covering in the absence of Annie Dayich who works for VA Pittsburgh for the Suicide Prevention Program. She shared that the Beaver County CoC Homeless Veteran Subcommittee is a committee that derived from a national statistic stating that in 2023, suicide rates of veterans who were diagnosed with homelessness at VHA, increased by 110% than those who were not diagnosed with homelessness. She stated that although Beaver County is rich in resources for all, Dina, Annie, and me wanted to create something that was solely focused on resources for veterans and would be easy to navigate. Some service providers know it can be difficult to understand, find or navigate veteran information or resources through the VA. The purpose of this committee is to simplify the way both veterans and veteran providers could find information. We started to collaborate with veteran oriented agencies including federal, state, and county veteran programs and then incorporated additional local agencies that services veterans in our areas. We also decided to bring in Butler County entities as well, who serve veterans, for some of our local residents that seek services in nearby communities. Through this committee, we have been diligently working on creating two projects:

1. A paper and virtual resource guide:
 - a. The paper resource guide is intended to be easily navigated with specific phone numbers for each agency broken into specific categories such as mental health, connection, veteran benefits, homelessness, etc. This front and back brochure is intended for local agencies to have available to any veteran or veteran-oriented service provider to use as they please.
 - b. The virtual resource guide is intended to be an extended version of the paper guide with additional information available on the CoC website. A QR code will be available on the paper guide to lead individuals to the more in-depth information for all of the above categories.
2. Train the Trainer Trainings: this training will be designed as an overview of all the resources available to our BC residents as well as how to understand and navigate veteran spaces including understanding VA SAVE Training, Military Culture, navigating VA programs, and other local resources.

The veteran's subcommittee meeting meets virtually on a bimonthly basis the last Thursday of the month at 1:30 PM. If you feel your agency would be an appropriate addition, please let Dina, Annie, or me know and we can provide you with additional information. We are diligently working on uniting veteran resources to make seeking help as smooth as possible!

Description of Beaver County Supportive Housing Programs

Community Assisted Residential Living (C.A.R.L.) is a permanent supportive housing program for homeless households with a disability. It is a tenant based rental model administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County. The Program focuses on households with the longest length of homelessness, homeless households with children, veterans, and victims of domestic violence. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Contact information: Mike Little at mlittle@beavercountyhousing.org

Crescent Commons is a permanent supportive housing program administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County which provides housing vouchers to participants who are chronically homeless with disabilities and who have exhausted all other housing options. At full operational capacity the program should house approximately 31 people. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Contact information: Melissa Grimes at mgrimes@beavercountyhousing.org

Friendship Homes is a 33 bed scattered permanent supportive housing program administered by the Salvation Army for both chronically homeless and non-chronically homeless individuals and families and with disabilities. In addition to housing, the program is funded to provide moderate case management services. Contact information: Renee Sannan at Renee.Sannan@use.salvationarmy.org

Stone Harbour is a transitional supportive housing program administered by Cornerstone Recovery and Supports (CRS) which provides supportive housing for 12 chronically homeless individuals struggling with co-occurring disorders of mental illness and substance abuse, as well as those with legal histories. Individuals live in a single site in Freedom PA. The program is funded to provide on-site case management services. Contact information: Chelsy Brogdon at cbrogdon@crscares.org

Salvation Army Rapid Re-Housing is a medium term rapid re-housing program for homeless households who score for rapid re-housing through Coordinated Entry and who need longer term financial assistance (up to 2 years). Individual assessment will determine length of financial support and types of supportive services offered. Contact information: Renee Sannan at Renee.Sannan@use.salvationarmy.org

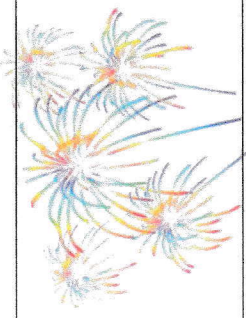
Safely Home is a medium term rapid re-housing program for homeless households fleeing DV situations. The Women's Center will also provide support to clients. Referrals come from CE and are verified by the Women's Center. Contact information: Melissa Grimes at mgrimes@beavercountyhousing.org

811 Program (not a McKinney Vento program)

A subsidized housing program for disabled adults (age 18-61) who are either in an institution or at risk of institutionalization and who are able to reside in the community with supports. Criteria include:

- Disabled and Medicaid eligible. Also eligible for long-term services and supports
- Income at or below 30% AMI
- Eligible for the Housing Authority
