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1. Open Discussion

Dina Ciabattoni (Continuum of Care) Reminded the group that all notes can be found online at the BCHMIS website.

Mike Little (Housing Authority of the County of Beaver) Reported an increase in individuals experiencing homelessness presenting in person at the housing authority office. The agency is observing gaps in services and is working to address and bridge these needs. Dina shared with the group that we can discuss this more in depth at the housing meeting.

Nancy Grieco (Red Cross) Introduced the disaster program manager, Paula and volunteer Lori. She reported 5 fires, that affected 17 adults and 1 child including a significant incident at Ambridge Towers. Attendees were encouraged to review the attached smoke detector installation flyer. For installation service please call 724.480.3170.

Haley Bell (Inglis) Reminded the group that monthly webinars are available and encouraged registration for the upcoming Landlord Engagement Webinar on March 17 at 4:00 PM. Additional details are included in the attached flyer.

Renee Sannan (The Salvation Army) Announced that SOAR has resumed in Pennsylvania. The program assists individuals experiencing homelessness with applying for social security benefits and supports timely application decisions. The application process to become a SOAR representative is now open and includes a free two-day training. Information for registration can be found in the save the date section.

Hotel Program

Ashley McLaughlin

Ashley explained that hotel program is a last resort option for individuals currently facing homelessness. Shelter placement is prioritized, and transportation to out-of-county shelters is available Monday through Friday 9 am to 4 pm. Individuals will be screened to

ensure they are not experiencing a mental or substance use crisis. Due to limited funding, hotel stays are capped at 10 days, approved by management in two-day increments based on demonstrated progress. If the client is not making progress, additional hotel assistance may not be approved. While at the hotel, clients are encouraged to seek shelter availability where more housing support services are provided. Jessica Sabol noted that hotels offer less structured support and may create additional challenges for clients. Ashley asked providers not to offer clients a hotel without consulting with The Cornerstone of Beaver County. Industrial Technology & Continuing Education at CCBC **Shalisa Anderson**
Shalisa explained the ITCE training programs. She shared these training programs are continuing education courses with a wide variety of course offerings for business programs and personal development. Customized trainings are available for businesses to assist their employees. Online self-paced training and in person courses are available for individual gain that could lead to an advanced career. Programs include mechatronics, process technology, construction management, EMT, wastewater treatment, and welding. Business, aviation, criminal justice, STEM, and cyber security programs are available to high school students for the Pathways program. All personal programs have the opportunity to be funded through CareerLink or United Way. WEDNET is a financial program available to assist companies with training. Point in Time Survey Details **Dina Ciabattoni**
Dina thanked all volunteers who assisted with the point in time survey. She shared how much she appreciated everyone for making changes to their schedules due to the weather. There was a total of 19 teams that canvassed the county for homeless individuals. The unofficial count for this year is 5 unsheltered individuals, which is an increase from last year. Three were single men, 2 residing outside and 1 in a trailer with questionable heat, and 1 couple staying in an abandoned building. Dina shared that many people assisting with planning and carrying out this year's survey. She also thanked BCBH for the major donation.

Bed Availability **Shante' Thompson**
See attached. Shante' reported limited bed availability, as reflected in the attached housing availability chart, and thanked partner programs for their collaboration in reducing waitlists. Some subsidized housing providers were unable to respond; however, individuals in need of housing are still encouraged to apply. Shante' explained that coordinated entry is a process that homeless individuals go through to see which housing programs they qualify for.

Description of Beaver County Supportive Housing Programs

Community Assisted Residential Living (C.A.R.L.) is a permanent supportive housing program for homeless households with a disability. It is a tenant based rental model administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County. The Program focuses on households with the longest length of homelessness, homeless households with children, veterans, and victims of domestic violence. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Contact information: Mike Little at mlittle@beavercountyhousing.org

Crescent Commons is a permanent supportive housing program administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County which provides housing vouchers to participants who are chronically homeless with disabilities and who have exhausted all other housing options. At full operational capacity the program should house approximately 31 people. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Contact information: Melissa Grimes at mgrimes@beavercountyhousing.org

Friendship Homes is a 33 bed scattered permanent supportive housing program administered by the Salvation Army for both chronically homeless and non-chronically homeless individuals and families and with disabilities. In addition to housing, the program is funded to provide moderate case management services. Contact information: Renee Sannan at Renee.Sannan@use.salvationarmy.org

Stone Harbour is a transitional supportive housing program administered by Cornerstone Recovery and Supports (CRS) which provides supportive housing for 12 chronically homeless individuals struggling with co-occurring disorders of mental illness and substance abuse, as well as those with legal histories. Individuals live in a single site in Freedom PA. The program is funded to provide on-site case management services. Contact information: Tammy Van Evera at tvanevera@crscares.org

Salvation Army Rapid Re-Housing is a medium term rapid re-housing program for homeless households who score for rapid re-housing through Coordinated Entry and who need longer term financial assistance (up to 2 years). Individual assessment will determine length of financial support and types of supportive services offered. Contact information: Renee Sannan at Renee.Sannan@use.salvationarmy.org

Safely Home is a medium term rapid re-housing program for homeless households fleeing DV situations. The Women's Center will also provide support to clients. Referrals come from CE and are verified by the Women's Center. Contact information: Melissa Grimes at mgrimes@beavercountyhousing.org

811 Program (not a McKinney Vento program)

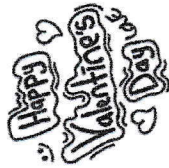
A subsidized housing program for disabled adults (age 18-61) who are either in an institution or at risk of institutionalization and who are able to reside in the community with supports. Criteria include:

- Disabled and Medicaid eligible. Also eligible for long-term services and supports
- Income at or below 30% AMI
- Eligible for the Housing Authority

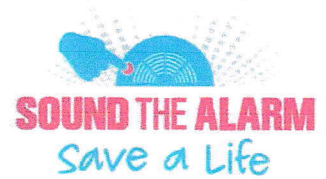

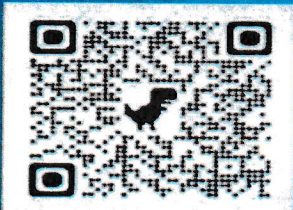

(JTBC), has launched **United Works**, a workforce development program for Beaver County residents who are working, sometimes multiple jobs, and still can't make ends meet. United Works can help people access valuable educational opportunities that were previously out of reach due to cost. The goal is to provide financial assistance for training needed to secure well-paying, meaningful jobs, and ultimately, transition to a higher level of financial stability.

United Works funds will specifically support tuition and supportive services for students who earn a little too much to qualify for other grants. This can allow more individuals to access the education and resources they need to thrive.

Job Training for Beaver County will work with the applicant to determine eligibility.

To be eligible, a person must:

- Be 18 years of age or older
- Have a high school diploma or GED
- Reside in Beaver County
- Provide verification that current household income is under ALICE household survival budget guidelines - <https://unitedforalice.org/household-budgets/pennsylvania>
- Be accepted into an eligible CCBC training program, an eligible Penn State Beaver training program, or a building and construction trades pre-apprenticeship or registered apprenticeship program
