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1. Open Discussion

Mike Little (Housing Authority of the County of Beaver) Introduced Jacki DaLonzo as part of the CARL program team. He shared the housing authority has availability at Sheffield Towers.

Clint Nahod (Soldier On) Informed the group of an open manager position. The salary is \$52,000 annually, applicants must possess a bachelor's degree and a valid driver's license. Those interested may apply through Indeed.

Desiree Mosura (Women's Center) Reported that the shelter is now open.

Courtney Cox (BCBH) Announced that the Beaver County Bounces Back event is scheduled for May 16th. Vendor and table spaces are available, including for spiritual and community support organizations. She also shared the yard sign competition is set to end tomorrow; however they will be extending submission until Monday. She encouraged individuals as well as providers to submit yard signs.

Holly Santa (Community Development Program) Reminded attendees that applications for HOME, CDBG, ESG, and HAP are due at 4 pm on March 30th. Applications can be submitted through the Community Development site.

Ann Brandt (Heritage Valley Family Medicine Center) Reported that they screening services will be provided at the Women's Center beginning in late April.

Emily Maze (CareerLink) Announced CareerLink will be holding a career fair April 9th from 10 am to 2 pm. Vendor tables are available for those interested.

Nancy Grieco (Red Cross) Reported 2 fires, that affected 6 adults and 4 children. She stated that everyone is in the process of making connections for resources.

Monique Anderson (Harmony House Salvation Army) Introduced Jawain Witt as the Harmony House new case manager.

Inglis Home Modification Program

Abigail Goetz

Abigail reported that the home modification program is a grant awarded program designed to complete small scale high impact modifications for adults 62 or older, for both renters and homeowners. Eligible applicants will receive an application packet, which includes requirements such as deed and tax documentation. Abigail encouraged referrals, noting that additional supportive programs may also be available for those ineligible. There is currently no waitlist, and modifications could be a two-week turnaround time. Please see the attachment for additional information or call 610.873.9595.

SNAP Update

Dina Ciabattoni

Dina shared that federal government rules changed in September for certain individuals who receive SNAP benefits. Certain SNAP recipients will be subject to SNAP work requirements and time limits. Under new federal rules, to keep or become eligible for SNAP benefits certain people will have to meet SNAP work requirements that include working, volunteering, or participating in an education or training program for at least 20 hours a week and report that you are meeting these requirements. Dina confirmed that homelessness is an exemption and that individuals participating in CoC and ESG programs are eligible for SNAP benefits.

Point in Time Survey Overview

Dina Ciabattoni

Dina stated that she had an updated count for the point in time survey. Unsheltered count is 3, with 2 living outside and 1 in a vehicle with no heat. The sheltered count is 174 in permanent supportive housing, 78 rapid re-housing, 9 transitional housing, and 47 emergency shelter with a total of 308.

Please complete the following checklist & include all required documents listed.

Proof of Income

- All household income must be verified for all household members 18 years of age and older. Current copies of all income sources must be included when submitting the application.

Proof of Identity

- Submit one proof of identity. Examples: Copy of Photo ID/Passport/Driver's license

Proof of Homeownership (For Homeowners Only)

Do you have current homeowner's insurance?

(Insurance document does not need to be included.) Yes No

- Copy of current full mortgage statement or copy of entire deed

Proof of Paid Property Taxes

Submit a copy of your **two** paid property tax receipts. They must be an official receipt that is stamped with the date of payment & the tax collector's name.

1. School District Real Estate Tax Receipt
2. Municipal/Township/County Real Estate Tax Receipt

Please Note: **Mobile Home Owners** are assessed **BOTH** School District Real Estate Taxes **AND** Municipal/Township/County Taxes

Proof of Renting (For Renters Only)

- Submit a copy of either your rental/lease agreement or a payment receipt

Power of Attorney (POA)

- You are only required to submit a copy of your POA if you need someone else to sign your signature for you on documents

Proof of Disability

- You are only required to submit Proof of disability if you have a diagnosis from the medical profession or a social service organization or receive Social Security Disability Insurance.

In July 2025, Republicans in Congress passed a bill that makes changes to the SNAP program. President Trump signed that bill into law. Some SNAP recipients now must meet work requirements and report that they are meeting this requirement to DHS. If SNAP recipients are not meeting this requirement, they will be limited to three months of SNAP benefits for a three-year period.

Who is exempt from SNAP work requirements?

One way you can receive SNAP benefits for more than three months is to let us know if you meet an exemption. You are exempt if you are:

- Living in a SNAP household with a child under 18 (*****Note: this exemption will lower to age 14 starting on 11/1/2025**);
- Unable to work because of a physical or mental health condition, whether or not you qualify for disability benefits;
- Pregnant;
- Needed in the home to care for an ill or disabled person;
- Receiving (or applied for) Unemployment Compensation (UC);
- Unable to work because of domestic violence;
- Participating in a drug or alcohol treatment program;
- Homeless, living in a shelter or halfway house, or staying with family or friends for 90 days or less;
- A veteran of any branch of the U.S. Military, National Guard, or reserves, regardless of type of discharge (*****Note: this exemption will end on 10/31/2025**);
- Someone who aged out of the foster care system and is currently under age 25 (*****Note: this exemption will end on 10/31/2025**); or
- Temporarily unemployed and expect to return to work in the next 60 days.

In some cases, we may need you to provide proof of your exemption. Your caseworker will let you know if you must do so.

2026 Point In Time Methods

The 2026 Point In Time survey was conducted from 8:00 pm on January 28, 2026 through January 29, 2026. It was originally scheduled for January 26th – 27th but due to a massive storm the day before we rescheduled the survey to give road crews time to clear the roads.

Both sheltered and unsheltered counts were conducted. Below are the methods used for each. The CoC Governing Board approved these methods on 1/9/26.

Sheltered Count

The HMIS Lead consulted with each of the TH, ES, PSH, and RRH programs to ensure completeness and accuracy of their data for the PIT survey. The Women’s Center provided data from their comparable database for their emergency shelter count and for the Safely Home RRH program.



Unsheltered Count

Continuum of Care partners were notified of the survey at the 10/9/25, the 11/13/25, 12/11/25 and the 1/8/26 Housing & Homeless Coalition meetings. The planning committee was comprised of housing programs (TCBC, HACB, TSA, CRS), Soldier On, Glade Run After School, BCBH, Penny Jones (landlord), and The Women's Center. 12 outreach teams and 4 drop-in sites were in operation.

A flyer was created with a QR code to access the survey. Signs were hung just before the survey so that households in need were not misled to wait for the survey to access assistance.

All surveyors were required to attend a mandatory training and to complete a quiz to demonstrate understanding of the definition of homelessness, familiarity with the survey and the mobile app, outreach strategies, and safety protocols. This training was held in person on 1/23/26. A recording was also provided for those who were unable to attend in person.

The County 911 Center sent a message to all of the Police Chiefs explaining the survey and to ask for any relevant information that they may be able to share. The outreach teams also contacted the police in the areas they covered. Several teams directly interacted with the police with some remembering the survey from previous years. Police were given new flyers and outreach bags (if they wanted them).

12 outreach teams canvassed the County visiting known homeless sites as well as sites where homeless people tend to spend time. Again a few teams canvassed during the 8 pm to 10 pm hours on the night of the 28th and others canvassed in the early morning hours or later in the day on the 29th depending on the areas they were covering. Also 6 specific sites were visited to conduct surveys on anyone who may present as homeless including soup kitchens, a drop-in center, and libraries. The Salvation Army had originally committed to loaning their mobile canteen to the survey effort but were unable to do so when the survey was rescheduled. Their assigned area was covered by an outreach team instead.

The planning committee developed a list of the items for the outreach bags. An Amazon wish list was created with items being delivered to The Cornerstone. Most of the items were donated by CoC Partners. The remaining items were purchased with Planning Grant match funds. This process worked well and reduced the work to load and unload and transport items. The Glade Run After School program assembled the outreach bags. We also purchased bins for each outreach team which greatly simplified the transport of the outreach bags to each team.

Youth strategies: The AIU blasted PIT information to all of the school districts. The CoC Coordination team also engaged the Head Start/Early Head Start program in the PIT survey. HS/EHS staff attended the training. We coordinated with the youth from the Glade Run After School program at Rochester School District to prepare the outreach bags.

Veteran strategies: 2 agencies that serve Veterans participated in planning the PIT survey and also conducted outreach. 1 veteran conducted outreach.



Homeless input: 3 Lived Experience Homeless committee members signed up to help with the survey. 1 was unavailable on the day of the survey due to an injury. The other 2 did not participate because the site they were assigned to was unexpectedly closed due to the massive amount of snow blocking the doors.

Suggestions for next year:

- Get bright flashlights with a wide beam
- Consider the challenge of darkness when scheduling
- Consider business hours when scheduling
- Call police before doing outreach
- Keep using the bins!
- Hot soup at the drop in centers would be great
- Buy the light/phone chargers early
- Use the Amazon wish list again
- Do outreach before the survey including at the hotels

Description of Beaver County Supportive Housing Programs

Community Assisted Residential Living (C.A.R.L.) is a permanent supportive housing program for homeless households with a disability. It is a tenant based rental model administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County. The Program focuses on households with the longest length of homelessness, homeless households with children, veterans, and victims of domestic violence. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Contact information: Mike Little at mittle@beavercountyhousing.org

Crescent Commons is a permanent supportive housing program administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County which provides housing vouchers to participants who are chronically homeless with disabilities and who have exhausted all other housing options. At full operational capacity the program should house approximately 31 people. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Contact information: Melissa Grimes at mgrimes@beavercountyhousing.org

Friendship Homes is a 33 bed scattered permanent supportive housing program administered by the Salvation Army for both chronically homeless and non-chronically homeless individuals and families and with disabilities. In addition to housing, the program is funded to provide moderate case management services. Contact information: Renee Sannan at Renee.Sannan@use.salvationarmy.org

Stone Harbour is a transitional supportive housing program administered by Cornerstone Recovery and Supports (CRS) which provides supportive housing for 12 chronically homeless individuals struggling with co-occurring disorders of mental illness and substance abuse, as well as those with legal histories. Individuals live in a single site in Freedom PA. The program is funded to provide on-site case management services. Contact information: Chelsy Brogdon at cbrogdon@crscares.org

Salvation Army Rapid Re-Housing is a medium term rapid re-housing program for homeless households who score for rapid re-housing through Coordinated Entry and who need longer term financial assistance (up to 2 years). Individual assessment will determine length of financial support and types of supportive services offered. Contact information: Renee Sannan at Renee.Sannan@use.salvationarmy.org

Safely Home is a medium term rapid re-housing program for homeless households fleeing DV situations. The Women's Center will also provide support to clients. Referrals come from CE and are verified by the Women's Center. Contact information: Melissa Grimes at mgrimes@beavercountyhousing.org

811 Program (not a McKinney Vento program)

A subsidized housing program for disabled adults (age 18-61) who are either in an institution or at risk of institutionalization and who are able to reside in the community with supports. Criteria include:

- Disabled and Medicaid eligible. Also eligible for long-term services and supports
- Income at or below 30% AMI
- Eligible for the Housing Authority
