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1. Open Discussion

Barbara Grossman (Center for Independent Living) Reminded the group that the deadline to register to be a vendor for their upcoming celebration is July 11th. Volunteers are still needed. She also shared that anyone who may need assistance with Medicaid or Medicare could contact their office for help with Medicaid PA health law.

Jennifer Snyder (Merakey) Announced the drug and alcohol overdose awareness day will be held August 28th from 4:30 pm to 7:30 pm at the courthouse. Flyer is attached. Jennifer also shared that she is working to obtain her licensing for a recovery house in Rochester. She's looking for additional properties.

Annie Dayich (Veteran's Association) Reminded the group the Shon Owens unity week has started, and today's vigil event begins at 5:30 pm at the courthouse. They are still accepting applications for volunteers for the event, you can scan the QR code on the flyer that is attached.

Denise DiVittis (Domestics) Shared that CareerLink will be hosting a resource fair on August 24th, the flyer is attached. She also shared September 11th there will be a re-entry summit at CCBC from 8:30 am – 2:30 pm.

Nancy Greico (Red Cross) Reported 2 fires in Beaver County for the month. 4 adults and 5 children were affected, and they have been connected with assistance. Francie from TCBC shared that 1 family is back in their apartment and the other family has been housed. No additional services are needed.

Kayla Board (Trails Ministries) Announced that she has a clothing building and can assist anyone in need of clothing. Kayla also shared the new hours for project id are Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm. Referrals must have the attached referral form completed by an agency representative and submitted to Emily. Flyer and referral form are attached.

Office on Aging Resources

Marcy Scott

Marcy shared that the office on aging can assist any Beaver County resident 60 years or older. Contact the office for referrals, to report concerns or abuse, and for assistance to connect with available resources. Programs include, SAP which is for small home repairs such as grab bars, or rails and whole home repairs which include ramps, sidewalk repairs, and repairs to roofs. Marcy shared that grass cutting and snow removal service is available to clients if someone is needing to go out to an appointment or if meals are being delivered. She stated that older adult protective services are available through a referral. An investigator will be assigned and meet with adults within 24 hours to come up with plans for support. Office on aging does not provide transportation but has partnered with BCTA for \$1.00 bus fare for clients. They also assist with services such as hot or frozen meals, shelf stable meals, grocery shopping, light cleaning, and services within the home. BCOA has 3 senior centers throughout Beaver County. The centers provide hot meals for seniors free of charge and \$6.00 for anyone else interested in lunches, they ask that you register a week ahead if possible. They also have activities and events at the centers such as chair volleyball, exercise classes, exercise room, café, and pool tables. Marcy shared that they received a grant from Hillman Foundation and are looking to provide additional senior activities to encourage community for senior adults and to help those who may be suffering from dementia. The office on aging provides farmers market vouchers of \$25.00 with 11 distribution sites. They can do nursing home eligibility assessments, ombudsman services, and have Medi counselors free of charge to review plans available. Anyone with questions or looking to make referrals should contact the office at 724.847.2262. Senior resource guides will be available to share soon.

2025 CoC Competition

Shante' Thompson

Shante' shared that on July 3rd Dina received an email indicating that a CoC Notice of Funding Opportunity will be released soon. The email stated that HUD invites CoCs to prepare for an application focused on treatment and recovery, reducing unsheltered homelessness, reducing returns to homelessness and increasing the earned income of participants. Currently, we are unsure of any additional details and are waiting for the Notice of Funding Opportunity to be released. She encouraged CoC partners to think about potential partnerships that may help advance the goals and work on developing them with the CoC funded programs.

Home4Good

Shante' Thompson

Shante' shared that the proposals for Home4Good are due to Community Development on July 25th by 12 pm. She shared that funds cannot be used for hard development costs such as real estate, construction, or rehabilitation. She stated that Beaver County has \$61,750 available. Description of Beaver County Supportive Housing Programs

Community Assisted Residential Living (C.A.R.L.) is a permanent supportive housing program for homeless households with a disability. It is a tenant based rental model administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County. The Program focuses on households with the longest length of homelessness, homeless households with children, veterans, and victims of domestic violence. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Contact information: Mike Little at mlittle@beavercountyhousing.org

Crescent Commons is a permanent supportive housing program administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County which provides housing vouchers to participants who are chronically homeless with disabilities and who have exhausted all other housing options. At full operational capacity the program should house approximately 31 people. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Contact information: Melissa Grimes at mgrimes@beavercountyhousing.org

Friendship Homes is a 33 bed scattered permanent supportive housing program administered by the Salvation Army for both chronically homeless and non-chronically homeless individuals and families and with disabilities. In addition to housing, the program is funded to provide moderate case management services. Contact information: Renee Sannan at Renee.Sannan@use.salvationarmy.org

Stone Harbour is a transitional supportive housing program administered by Cornerstone Recovery and Supports (CRS) which provides supportive housing for 12 chronically homeless individuals struggling with co-occurring disorders of mental illness and substance abuse, as well as those with legal histories. Individuals live in a single site in Freedom PA. The program is funded to provide on-site case management services. Contact information: Tammy Van Evera at tvanevera@crscares.org

Salvation Army Rapid Re-Housing is a medium term rapid re-housing program for homeless households who score for rapid re-housing through Coordinated Entry and who need longer term financial assistance (up to 2 years). Individual assessment will determine length of financial support and types of supportive services offered. Contact information: Renee Sannan at Renee.Sannan@use.salvationarmy.org

Safely Home is a medium term rapid re-housing program for homeless households fleeing DV situations. The Women's Center will also provide support to clients. Referrals come from CE and are verified by the Women's Center. Contact information: Melissa Grimes at mgrimes@beavercountyhousing.org

811 Program (not a McKinney Vento program)

A subsidized housing program for disabled adults (age 18-61) who are either in an institution or at risk of institutionalization and who are able to reside in the community with supports. Criteria include:

- Disabled and Medicaid eligible. Also eligible for long-term services and supports
- Income at or below 30% AMI
- Eligible for the Housing Authority
