Welcome and Housekeeping

1. Open Discussion

Denise DiVittis (DRS) Reported that the re-entry summit assisted 54 attendees and 23 certificates for expungement were issued. She reminded the group that the next re-entry summit is scheduled for November 25th.

Annie Dayich (Veteran's Association) Shared the upcoming Mental Gains free yoga event will take place October 17th from 6 pm to 8 pm at the Sangha Center in Beaver Falls. She also shared, November 8th is Veteran's appreciation day at the Aliquippa Library from 11 am to 1 pm and a Breakfast with Santa event on December 19th from 9 am to 1 pm at Trails in Beaver Falls. She stated the event will include breakfast, and free gifts for attendees registered. Annie shared that donations of toys are needed for the upcoming event and if anyone is interested in donating or need additional information, they could contact her. All flyers are attached.

Renee Sannan (Salvation Army) Provided an update on the SOAR program. Renee shared that PA's Dept. of Human Services has set up and activated an online SOAR training center for anyone interested in becoming a SOAR representative. Once a person has completed the training they can start submitting SSDI applications to Lauren for approval. This process replaces the one that previously existed at the SAMSHA technical assistance center.

She also shared that social security will be integrating new staff at the branch offices to focus on automation and answering phones to increase efficiency in accesses services. They are working to eliminate silos and decrease wait times to serve people within 8 minutes. While some offices, including the Pittsburgh office will be closing, the Ambridge office remains open. Social security is working with DOC to pay for medical records and allow for easier options to verify individuals. Verification options will be at local post offices, or by utilizing IDme online. In compliance with a new Executive Order, SSA will no longer issue paper checks. All funds will be issued through direct deposit or onto a debit card. Changes to direct deposit can only be made in office.

Dina Ciabottoni (CoC) Shared the Red Cross update for Nancy Greico. Dina reported 2 fires with 2 families, affecting 6 adults and 3 children.

She shared the Cornerstone of Beaver County will be hosting a Party with a Purpose event on October 11th. Doors open at 5 pm and the event begins at 6 pm. See below for the link to purchase tickets.

Dina also shared that the shelter is hiring for a full-time overnight position. The overnight shift is from 11 pm to 7 am. Contact TCBC at 724.846.6400 if interested.

World Homeless Day is October 10th and will take place at the Beaver County Courthouse starting at 12 pm. All are welcome!

Monique Anderson (SHAY FOUNDATION) Shared details about her upcoming SHAY Foundation event (see attached flyers). She stated they are accepting donations from September 21st through November 9th for their Harvest Bags of Love. This event will provide families with the ingredients to prepare Thanksgiving meals in their homes. She shared that they hosted a book bag giveaway for back to school and served 470 students.

Monique Anderson (Salvation Army) Monique also reminded the group of the Recovery and Wellness program for those in need of support for their long term recovery and who are residing in a CoC funded residential program. She stated anyone interested in making a referral can call 724.728.3350.

2. Agenda

DV Awareness Month & WC Updates

The Women's Center Raquel announced their Open House at the newly renovated shelter on Nov. 13th from noon-2 pm and 5 pm-7pm. Refreshments will be offered. As the guests are returning to the shelter and the holidays are coming, the WC is in need of gift cards, and towels, blankets. They also need assistance with assembling the new beds for the shelter. They are looking for volunteers any time between 10/20-10/31. If interested, call the WC at 724.775.0131.

Ann Colella-Murray shared domestic violence statistics from the American Bar Association. The statistics stated that 38% of domestic violence victims become homeless at some point and that 90% of homeless women have experienced physical or sexual abuse at some point in their lifetime. Domestic violence has been reported as the leading cause of homelessness of children. There has been a lack of resources for these individuals needing housing assistance. In 2022 it was reported that in one day 1,642 domestic violence programs were unable to meet the request of 7,000 people in need of shelter. Ann stated that abusers often affect the stability of survivors, making them dependent. Survivors are often unemployed, have poor credit scores and rental history.

PIT & Homeless Memorial Planning

Dina notified the group of the upcoming Point in Time planning efforts. Those interested in planning are invited to join the meeting via zoom October 17th at 10 am (the link is below).

Dina also shared that the Homeless Memorial event will take place mid-December to recognize homeless individuals who have passed away. She noted that the Memorial generally takes place in the meeting and we have also been fortunate to have the Commissioners issue a public proclamation recognizing the event and those who passed away. The planning effort for this event is just starting. She shared a sign-up sheet and Shante' noted those in the Zoom chat who expressed interest too. Dina will send out a date for the first meeting soon.

Impact of Federal Government Shut Down

Dina Ciabattoni

Dina shared the National Alliance to End Homelessness analysis of how programs will be impacted in the shutdown (see attached). Medicaid/Medicare should not see any disruptions, but new applications could be delayed. Social security should not see any interruptions, but new cards and new applications will likely be delayed. HUD assistance grant funds are currently accessible. She did state that without a CoC competition no new funds can be released. Our CoC funded programs have funds through April 2026. SNAP benefits for October will not be delayed, and WIC. The County Assistance Office (CAO) reported that LIHEAP pre-season applications (for those who received LIHEAP last year) are processed, but there are no funds currently available due to the shutdown. The regular LIHEAP application process is scheduled to open November 3rd. The CAO reported that TANF and Medicaid should be okay due to being funded through larger multi-year appropriations. Although changes could be coming to Medicaid, currently there should be no issues. The CAO reported being under normal operations.

Cyndi Gilkey from Neighborhood Legal Services reported no changes or interruptions in their offices. Dina reminded the group of the free meal list available at www.bchmis.info and that we are working to ensure all info is current. Alexa from Columbia Gas shared that they very much support the LIHEAP program as they use the funds to assist with overdue bills. She also mentioned the upcoming virtual town hall. Doug Turner from the PA Dept of Military and Veterans Affairs shared that the following benefits and services are operating without interruptions: medical centers/benefits, burials, appeals, call centers, suicide prevention, and care givers support. Symboline from CRS shared that Operation Homefront has gift cards available for veterans (<https://operationhomefront.org>).

GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN UPDATES on SOCIAL SERVICES

What Does a Government Shutdown Mean?

A [government shutdown](#) disrupts the provision of government services: the majority of federal employees will be furloughed if Congress and the President are not able to agree on a budget (or a short-term continuing resolution) by a certain time. For this budget, the deadline was midnight on September 30; the government has been shut down since then until Congress can reach an agreement.

Depending on how long the shutdown occurs, a wide range of programs that assist people experiencing homelessness could be disrupted or delayed.

Potential Impacts on Federal Programs

The [most recent contingency plan](#) from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for a lapse in appropriations (September 2025) provides information on what programs may be impacted by a shutdown.

Programs That Will Not Be Disrupted

- **People will continue to receive Medicaid and Medicare benefits and subsidized coverage through the health care marketplace during a government shutdown.** No disruption is expected.
- **People will continue to receive Social Security and Supplemental Security Income payments without interruption during a shutdown.** However, some services such as replacing Medicare or Social Security Cards may be suspended. Disability determinations and the processing of work visas will likely be delayed.
- **People will continue to receive assistance through programs funded under HUD's Homeless Assistance Grants (HAG) during a shutdown.** In general, recipients of HUD's HAG funding will be able to continue operations like normal; however, anything that requires HUD staff approval or action will likely need to wait until shut-down is over. HUD's contingency plan for this shutdown does allow activities associated with making renewal award announcements and executing grant agreements for eligible grantees. It does not seem to make an exception for initiating a new competitive process. Therefore, it is unlikely that HUD will be able to issue a FY2025 Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for CoC Program funds until the shutdown is resolved.

Programs That May Be Disrupted

- **Households will continue to receive HUD assistance during a short shutdown, but a longer shutdown may impact access to rental assistance, depending on when a**

shutdown occurs and its length. If a shutdown ends before the end of the year, funding for HUD rental assistance should continue as normal: Housing Choice Vouchers, public housing, and Project-Based Rental Assistance are all funded on a calendar year cycle. However, a prolonged period could lead to delays in renewing contracts and financial uncertainty of a shutdown may lead public housing agencies to stop reissuing housing vouchers.

- **People could lose access to food assistance if a government shutdown lasts too long.** In the short-term, people who receive help from the major federally-funded, state- or locally-administered nutrition programs are not likely to be at risk of losing access to benefits. SNAP should continue uninterrupted throughout October. However, a shutdown lasting more than two weeks could disrupt access to [WIC](#) depending on the state. It could also cause challenges for people needing to apply for assistance for the first time and/or delays in renewing benefits.
- **People's access to Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), including cash assistance, will depend on their state's policy choices.** During a government shutdown, it is likely that quarterly federal payments to states that fund TANF would not be made, but states can make policy choices that would allow them to continue providing benefits and services without interruption.

Updates from the Beaver County Assistance Office

- October SNAP will not be affected. No answer on whether November SNAP funds were set aside. In the last government shutdown, funds were set aside for November SNAP.
- LIHEAP preseason applications (those who received LIHEAP last year) are being accepted and processed. But these LIHEAP payments are on hold until the state receives the federal funding. The regular LIHEAP application process opens on 11/3/2025 so there is still time for the government to reopen by then.
- Medicaid and TANF should be business as usual since they are funded in larger multi-year appropriations. Changes could be coming to Medicaid but no one should be impacted by potential changes yet.
- Otherwise, the Beaver County Assistance Office is under normal operation.

Description of Beaver County Supportive Housing Programs

Community Assisted Residential Living (C.A.R.L.) is a permanent supportive housing program for homeless households with a disability. It is a tenant based rental model administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County. The Program focuses on households with the longest length of homelessness, homeless households with children, veterans, and victims of domestic violence. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Contact information: Mike Little at mittle@beavercountyhousing.org

Crescent Commons is a permanent supportive housing program administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County which provides housing vouchers to participants who are chronically homeless with disabilities and who have exhausted all other housing options. At full operational capacity the program should house approximately 31 people. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Contact information: Melissa Grimes at mgrimes@beavercountyhousing.org

Friendship Homes is a 33 bed scattered permanent supportive housing program administered by the Salvation Army for both chronically homeless and non-chronically homeless individuals and families and with disabilities. In addition to housing, the program is funded to provide moderate case management services. Contact information: Renee Sannan at Renee.Sannan@use.salvationarmy.org

Stone Harbour is a transitional supportive housing program administered by Cornerstone Recovery and Supports (CRS) which provides supportive housing for 12 chronically homeless individuals struggling with co-occurring disorders of mental illness and substance abuse, as well as those with legal histories. Individuals live in a single site in Freedom PA. The program is funded to provide on-site case management services. Contact information: Tammy Van Evera at tvanevera@crscares.org

Salvation Army Rapid Re-Housing is a medium term rapid re-housing program for homeless households who score for rapid re-housing through Coordinated Entry and who need longer term financial assistance (up to 2 years). Individual assessment will determine length of financial support and types of supportive services offered. Contact information: Renee Sannan at Renee.Sannan@use.salvationarmy.org

Safely Home is a medium term rapid re-housing program for homeless households fleeing DV situations. The Women's Center will also provide support to clients. Referrals come from CE and are verified by the Women's Center. Contact information: Melissa Grimes at mgrimes@beavercountyhousing.org

811 Program (not a McKinney Vento program)

A subsidized housing program for disabled adults (age 18-61) who are either in an institution or at risk of institutionalization and who are able to reside in the community with supports. Criteria include:

- Disabled and Medicaid eligible. Also eligible for long-term services and supports
- Income at or below 30% AMI
- Eligible for the Housing Authority


