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## **1. Open Discussion**

**Amy Jurich (The Salvation Army/Harmony House)** Reported that Harmony House has one open apartment available. Harmony House is a structured recovery-based housing program that provides housing assistance for up to one year. Eligibility requirements include CYS involvement and being in recovery. If clients are in active addiction and need treatment, they will work with them to reserve the apartment until they complete treatment. The program will work to remove barriers to maintain housing and sustain long term recovery. For more details call, 724.728.3350.

**Emily Maze (PA CareerLink)** Announced the Re-entry Summit will be held August 28<sup>th</sup> at the Community College of Beaver County. This is a free event, with vendors and resources available to assist individuals return to the workforce. Vendors are still needed for this event. **Sinika Calloway (Beaver County VA Clinic)** Announced an upcoming Town Hall meeting for veterans on June 22<sup>nd</sup> from 12 pm to 4 pm at the Baden Legion. She stated that veterans not enrolled in VA benefits should bring their DD214 for assistance.

**Nancy Grieco (Red Cross)** Reported 2 fires in Beaver County. One single family fire occurred in New Brighton that affected 1 adult, 2 children, and a dog. A multi-family fire in Rochester that affected 2 adults. All clients have been connected with assistance.

**Dina Ciabattoni (CoC)** Reminded the group of the upcoming Unity Week beginning July 7<sup>th</sup>, see attached flyer. She also shared an article (attached) from the National Low Income Housing Coalition that discusses HUD's proposed rollback of LGBTQ protections including requiring shelters to admit individuals based on their sex at birth and not their identified gender. HUD is currently seeking public comment on the proposed changes. The article includes the link to provide comments to HUD.

## 2. Agenda

### *Veteran Leadership Program*

*Jenna Robinson*

Jenna, a representative from the Veterans Leadership Program (VLP) provided an overview of services available to veterans across approximately 30 counties in Pennsylvania, Ohio, and New York including Beaver County. VLP offers Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF), employment services, suicide prevention services, and community support programs. Veterans can request assistance through VLP's website, where referrals are reviewed and intake staff contact veterans to assess needs and determine eligibility. VLP strives to follow up within 48 hours and works proactively to prevent homelessness by advocating with landlords, utility providers, the VA, and community partners. Services may include housing stabilization, rental and utility arrears assistance, security deposits, moving and storage assistance, vehicle repairs, food assistance, household furnishings, and case management. VLP emphasizes individualized support, connecting veterans to both internal programs and community resources to address housing, employment, benefits, and other barriers. Jenna also highlighted the importance of collaboration with local veteran-serving organizations, including The Cornerstone of Beaver County and Soldier On, to ensure veterans receive the most appropriate services. VLP welcomes ongoing partnership opportunities, referrals, and participation. Eligibility for housing assistance is generally based on veteran status, housing need, and income requirements. Veterans who are not eligible for one program may be referred to alternative resources. Dina stressed that the three veteran serving organizations in Beaver County do offer some of the same programming but they each also offer unique offerings. The collaboration between these agencies comprehensively meets veterans' needs. Dina welcomed Jenna at future Housing & Homeless Coalition meetings.

### *DV Bonus and Home4Good Funding Opportunities*

*Dina Ciabattoni*

Dina announced that HUD released the FY CoC Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) on June 1. The NOFO does include new funding through the CoC and Domestic Violence (DV) Bonuses. Eligible project types for CoC bonus funding include Coordinated Entry, HMIS, Transitional Housing, and Supportive Services. The estimated amount of funding for the CoC Bonus is approximately \$585,826. DV Bonus funds can be used for Supportive Services and Transitional Housing. The estimated amount for the DV Bonus is \$781,101 for DV Bonus projects. Dina noted that once HUD confirms the amounts for each Bonus the Request for Proposals will be updated and emailed to the Coalition.

Requests for Proposals (RFPs) are available on the Community Development website at: <https://www.beavercountypa.gov/departments/community-development> under Invitations to Bid and Proposals. Proposals are due to Community Development by July 10<sup>th</sup> at 12 pm. Agencies interested in applying are required to discuss project ideas with Dina prior to submission to ensure eligibility and alignment with local community needs.

The mission of the Housing and Homeless Coalition of Beaver County is to provide support, direction, and collaboration in effectively addressing the issues of homelessness and affordable, sustainable housing in Beaver County by identifying and utilizing all available resources.

Dina stated that as the projects work on their applications (new and renewals) and the CoC Coordination team works on the CoC Application, you may be contacted for letters of support, program information, or other documentation. This information may be used to demonstrate the partnership and to meet HUD expectations. Your input could strengthen the applications. She asked for partners to be on the lookout for such requests. She thanked everyone for the support and partnerships offered to the effort of ending homelessness every day!

Additionally, the Home for Good funding opportunity was released on June 3<sup>rd</sup>. \$53,200 is available to support a broad range of homeless prevention and housing stability activities. Proposals are due by 12 pm on July 23<sup>rd</sup>.

## *Bed Availability*

*Shante' Thompson*

Shante' reviewed the attached housing availability chart with the group. She noted that most housing programs are currently at capacity, however, limited openings remain available with Stone Harbour, Cornerstone Recovery & Supports' CRR group homes for female spots, rapid rehousing, Harmony House, and the Men's Shelter. Additionally, she shared that the following locations have availability, Valley View 2 bedrooms, HUD 811 program in Koppel, and Sheffield Towers.

### **HUD Continuum of Care Funding**

CoC Funding is used to support the communitywide commitment to ending homelessness. Our CoC funding supports three PSH, two RRH programs, and one TH program. ## Description of Beaver County Supportive Housing Programs

**Community Assisted Residential Living (C.A.R.L.)** is a permanent supportive housing program for homeless households with a disability. It is a tenant based rental model administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County. The Program focuses on households with the longest length of homelessness, homeless households with children, veterans, and victims of domestic violence. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. **Crescent Commons** is a permanent supportive housing program administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County which provides housing vouchers to participants who are chronically homeless with disabilities and who have exhausted all other housing options. At full operational capacity the program should house approximately 31 people. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. **Friendship Homes** is a 33 bed scattered permanent supportive housing program administered by the Salvation Army for both chronically homeless and non-chronically homeless individuals and families and with disabilities. In addition to housing, the program is funded to provide moderate case management services. **Stone Harbour** is a transitional supportive housing program administered by Cornerstone Recovery and Supports (CRS) which provides supportive housing for 12 chronically homeless individuals struggling with co-occurring disorders of mental illness and substance abuse, as well as those with legal histories. Individuals live in a single site in Freedom PA. The program is funded to provide on-site case management services. **Salvation Army Rapid Re-Housing** is a medium term rapid re-housing program for homeless households who score for rapid re-housing through Coordinated Entry and who need longer term financial assistance (up to 2 years). Individual assessment will determine length of financial support and types of supportive services offered. **Safely Home** is a medium term rapid re-housing program for homeless households fleeing DV situations. The Women's Center will also provide support to clients. 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### **811 Program** (not a McKinney Vento program)

A subsidized housing program for disabled adults (age 18-61) who are either in an institution or at risk of institutionalization and who are able to reside in the community with supports. Criteria include:

- Disabled and Medicaid eligible. Also eligible for long-term services and supports
- Income at or below 30% AMI
- Eligible for the Housing Authority

# Take Action to Oppose HUD's Proposed Rollback of LGBTQ+ Protections in HUD Programs - Comments Due June 29

HUD's recent Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM), "[Equal Access to Housing in HUD Programs Revisions](#)," (see [Memo, 5/4](#)) seeks to roll back HUD regulations that protect access to HUD programs for LGBTQ+ people. Among the proposed changes, HUD would require that access to HUD-funded shelters be made in accordance with a person's sex (as defined by HUD), removing the requirement that shelters serve individuals consistent with their gender identity.

messaging around the rulemaking focuses on shelter access,

HUD's proposal is much broader than that. The Proposed Rule would eliminate

LGBTQ+ protections across a range of HUD programs. Components of the rule include:

- Removing all references to “gender,” “gender identity,” and “sexual orientation” and replacing them with “sex,” eliminating protections for LGBTQ+ individuals’ nondiscriminatory access to shelter and HUD programs, including Section 8 housing/other housing programs, fair housing enforcement and administration, mortgage programs, homelessness and domestic violence programs, and community development programs.
- Allowing facilities, like single-sex shelters, to “require reasonable assurances or evidence to establish a person’s sex,” and removing a prohibition on intrusive inquiries.
- Attempting to preempt any conflicting state or local laws (i.e., laws that offer protections based on sexual orientation and gender identity) within the context of HUD Office of Community Planning and Development (CPD) programs.

### *Background on Equal Access*

When [one in three](#) transgender people experience homelessness in their lives, LGBTQ+ youth [make up 40%](#) of the homeless youth population, and transgender people report [feeling unsafe](#) in emergency shelters, these realities demand an intentional commitment to creating pathways to safe, decent, affordable housing that addresses inequities. New [research](#) from NAEH and A4TE extended upon the 2022 U.S. Transgender Survey to show further impacts of housing discrimination on the lives of transgender people, including increased likelihood of facing verbal and physical violence, experiencing homelessness, and considering suicide (see [Memo, 6/8](#)).

[Equal Access Rule](#) required that access to HUD-assisted or -insured programs be made regardless of one’s actual or perceived sexual

orientation, gender identity, or marital status. HUD [updated the rule](#) in 2016. The updates largely focused on the barriers transgender and gender nonconforming people face in securing equal access to shelter. The 2016 Rule required that all housing/services funded by CPD ensure equal access to programs for individuals consistent with their gender identity. The 2016 amendments prohibited intrusive questioning as well as asking for anatomical information, or for physical, medical, or documentary evidence of one's gender identity.

### *Trump Administration Targets LGBTQ+ People, Fails to Enforce Equal Access to Housing*

However, in 2020, the Trump administration attempted to weaken protections for transgender and gender nonconforming individuals seeking emergency shelter through [proposed changes](#) to the Equal Access Rule. The 2020 proposal received over 66,000 comments, an overwhelming response signifying public resistance to the then-proposed changes. In 2021, then-President Biden's [Executive Order 13998](#) reinforced laws that prohibited sex discrimination, and the 2020 proposed rule was withdrawn.

Yet in 2025, President Trump's [EO 14168](#) expressed the administration's intent to roll back civil rights protections for transgender and gender nonconforming individuals and named the 2016 Rule specifically. In February, HUD Secretary Scott Turner announced the halting of ongoing or future enforcement actions for the 2016 Rule (see [Memo, 2/10/25](#)). The current Proposed Rule continues in this effort, while also removing language from HUD regulations (beyond CPD regulations) offering protection from discrimination based on sexual orientation or gender identity. Importantly, the current Proposed Rule goes much farther to roll back LGBTQ+ protections in HUD programmatic regulations than the 2020 proposed rulemaking. NLIHC strongly opposes this latest attempt by the administration to roll back critical protections for the LGBTQ+ community.

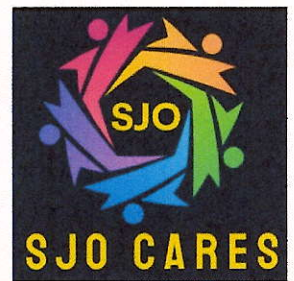

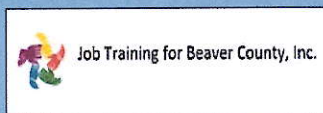
